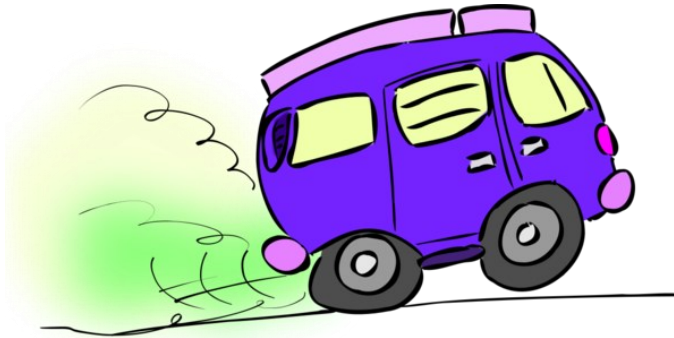

Traveling this summer?

Any time you plan on traveling out of Oregon it is a great idea to put a travel alert on your debit and/or credit cards that you plan on using. This could save you the headache of having your card blocked. A travel alert simply notifies the card company that you will be in that particular destination at the particular time you indicated. This, however, does not mean your card will not get compromised. Make sure you always check your monthly statement or sign up for home banking.



Be Careful....Not All Thieves Are Stupid

1. Long—Term Parking:

Some people left their car in the long-term parking at San Jose while away, and someone broke into the car. Using the information on the car's registration in the glove compartment, they drove the car to the people's home in Pebble Beach and robbed it. So I guess if we are going to leave the car in long-term parking, we should NOT leave the registration/insurance cards in it, nor your remote garage door opener.

2. GPS:

Someone had their car broken into while they were at a football game. Their car was parked on the green which was adjacent to the football fans. Things stolen from the car included a garage door remote control, some money and GPS which had been prominently mounted on the dashboard. When the victims got home, they found that their house had been ransacked and just about everything worth anything had been stolen. The thieves had used the GPS to guide them to the house. They then used that garage remote control to open the garage door and gain entry to the house. The thieves knew the owners were at the football game, they knew what time the game was scheduled to finish and so they knew how much time they had to clean out the house. Something to consider if you have a GPS—don't put your home address in it. Put a nearby address in it (like a store or gas station) so you can still find your way home if you need to.

3. CELL PHONES:

A lady has now changed her habit of how she lists her names on her cell phone after her handbag was stolen. Her handbag, which contained her cell phone, credit card, wallet, etc., was stolen. Twenty minutes later when she called her husband, her husband says, "I received your text asking about our PIN number and I replied a little while ago." When they rushed to the bank, the staff told them all the money was already withdrawn.

Moral lesson:

- do not disclose the relationship between you and the people in your contact list.
- When sensitive info is being asked through texts, CONFIRM by calling back.
- When you're being texted by friends or family to meet them somewhere, call back to confirm that the message came from them.

4. PURSE IN THE GROCERY CART SCAM:

A lady went grocery-shopping at a local mall and left her purse sitting in the children's seat of the cart while she reached something off a shelf. Her wallet was stolen, and she reported it to the store personnel. After returning home, she received a phone call from the Mall Security to say that they had her wallet and that although there was no money in it, it did still hold her personal papers. She immediately went to pick up her wallet, only to be told by Mall Security that they had not called her. By the time she returned again, her house had been broken into and burglarized. The thieves knew that by calling and saying they were Mall Security, they could lure her out of her house long enough for them to burglarize it.
